Dear Friends.

December 2018

I am delighted to be asked to write this this piece in The Herald as we enter the season of Advent and Christmas, and as we look towards a future where Poynton Methodist Church, Green Close Methodist Church and the Macclesfield Circuit are united in mission and ministry. You may or may not know that I am currently the Superintendent Minister of the Macclesfield Circuit, this my third year in the post having previously served in West Yorkshire. I'm sure there will be chances for us to get to know one another better in the months ahead.

For now, let me tell you one thing about myself, I have had a tendency over the years, to find myself coming, as the expression goes, "late to the party". That is, I sometimes find myself realising certain things later than I should! Let me explain: I was never very interested in school work, didn't work very hard, and decided academic work wasn't for me. But when I began my undergraduate degree at Cliff College, I realised I could do the work and quite enjoyed it! Late to the party! A few years later my brother and his wife tried to convince me that I should watch the TV show Friends. "No" I thought "I have avoided it for most of the 1990s, it's not for me". After a few weeks of nagging, I did watch it and realised what I'd been missing! Late to the party! Even today friends tell me I should watch the TV show Game of Thrones, I have no interest in it. but have a horrible feeling in five or six years I'll watch it, like it, and will once again be late to the party! It's easy for any of us to miss the party really. It can be because we decide something isn't for us, because we don't pay attention, or because we have heard something so often that we miss what it's all about.

How many Advents have you travelled through? How many Carol services have you been to? How many Nativity plays have you watched? I imagine it's quite a few! We know the readings from the Bible, we know how the story builds up week by week through Advent, we know the great Advent carols, Christmas carols, and Epiphany carols. Yet every year I have to stop and make sure I see the wonder of the season and know its great truth deep within my soul. I don't want to miss the party and go through the motions of Advent and Christmas, I want to be met with wonder once again!

In his book 'God is in the Manger', Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote: "God travels wonderful ways with human beings, but he does not comply with the views and opinions of people. God does not go the way that people want to prescribe for him; rather, his way is beyond all comprehension, free and self-determined beyond all proof ... Only the humble believe him and rejoice that God is so free and so marvellous that he does wonders where people despair, that he takes what is little and lowly and makes it marvellous. And that is the wonder of all wonders, that God loves the lowly ... God is not ashamed of the lowliness of human beings. God marches right in. He chooses people as his instruments and performs his wonders where one would least expect them. God is near to lowliness; he loves the lost, the neglected, the unseemly, the excluded, the weak and broken."

Whatever you do this advent, whatever your plans for Christmas and the New Year, don't be late to the greatest party of all – stop, listen and know it once again!

God comes down, he bows the sky, and shows himself our friend:
God the invisible appears:
God, the blest, the great I AM, sojourns in this vale of tears, and Jesus is his name.

PRAYER.


There are many opportunities for prayer in our church and you will be very welcome to join any of the following groups: -



'Striking out': Poems and stories from the Camino by Stephen Cottrell. Published by Canterbury Press at £9.99. Also available as an e-book.



Stephen Cottrell is Bishop of Chelmsford. On a September morning in 2016, he stepped out of his front door, walked 2 miles to his local railway station and so began the 700-kilometre pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela. He went via the least travelled route across northern Spain, for he yearned for the solitude of the road.

The book is a spiritual diary of that journey. In the introduction, Bishop Stephen explains how the travelling, rather than the arriving is the most important part of the pilarimage.

The pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela is perhaps the greatest and most well-known walking pilgrimage in the world. 'Striking out' is not a guide book to the walk, but tells how Stephen was feeling and what the walking was teaching him.

There are poems in the book. Each one is preceded by a story and a reflection that places the poems in the context of the journey travelled.

The book is arranged in four sections, each with seven paired reflections of poetry and prose separated by photographs. It is a thin book, but it really is a gem.

For this I have to prepare a 'creative presentation' on Radical Grace (answers on a postcard, please), as well as face questions in two small meetings (approx. half hour in each) and then questions from

the full group. I will be ready for my lunch

HYMNOLOGY ON A MONDAY MORNING - 37

'Dear Lord and Father of mankind' StF 495; HP 673; MP 111.

John Greenleaf Whittier (1807-92) was born in Haverhill, Massachusetts, USA where some of the earliest European settlers lived when Haverhill was an entirely Quaker society. Worship for them meant sitting in prayerful silence waiting for the Holy Spirit to move them to speak. At that time slavery was a burning issue, and the young Whittier as a journalist took up the anti-slavery cause. He called it 'the national crime' and was frequently attacked for his views, and he found solace in writing poetry.

In 1872 he wrote what he called a hymn poem, 'The brewing of Soma'. It had seventeen verses, and verse 12 is the start of the hymn, "Dear Lord and father of mankind." (The 'soma' was a drug, a potent drink brewed by Hindu priests that caused wild behaviour!)

One writer, John Bell, said it is really a penitential hymn, and a peculiar choice for a wedding service for which it is quite popular – "forgive our foolish ways?" – "breathe through the heats of our desire?"

But other lines bring special memories – "O Sabbath rest by Galilee", perhaps special places, the Holy Land pilgrimages?

John Bell, also a hymn writer, says that the tune 'Repton' accounts for the hymn's enormous popularity. It is a 'soft' tune that gives a feeling of wellbeing. It can help us forget our cares in worrying times. "Drop thy still dews of quietness" sung unaccompanied shows how an American Quaker hymn, sung to a Welshman's tune still has the power to help us find that "still small voice of calm."


The angels will each have a tag attached with a Christmas greeting from PMC and an invitation to take the angel home.
